Liaison Report to MHLS Board of Trustees from Directors Association Meeting September 8, 2011 MHLS Auditorium

Action Items:

Discussion Items:

- 1. Executive Director Mike Nyerges and Merribeth Advocate attended Public Library System Directors Organization Conference; learned, among other things, that 501C3s are able to lobby and form PACs.
- 2. Nyerges reported that a number of libraries have been contending with police inquiries; both he and Rebekkah Smith-Aldrich reminded all member libraries to review and update (or establish) policies for dealing with law enforcement.
- 3. Nyerges reminded all that the MHLS survey has been released and is due October 7.
- 4. Advocate reported that a number of Big Books have been added to the MHLS lending collection, including many made possible by a generous donation from Faith Johnson of Town of Ulster Library.
- 5. Advocate also noted that the popularity of e-books continues to rise, suggested member libraries consider future allotment of collection development money to reflect growing trend.
- 6. Rebekkah Smith-Aldrich reminded member libraries that while we are in the midst of funding votes, all should consider what the best sustainable and secure funding options are to that end, a workshop will be held addressing funding issues at MHLS.
- 7. Smith-Aldrich announced a series of workshops to be held as part of the Building Your Base grant. The workshops will focus on social media and marketing.
- 8. Shedrick reported new OPAC has been launched. Also reviewed, along with committee members, the possibility of becoming an early adapter of the Sierra ILS system offered by Millennium.
- 9. 2012 Member Library Database & Downloadable Costs were reviewed; will be voted upon by membership at the next DA meeting.
