


# **Executive Director's Report to MHLS Board – September 2014**

# 1) MOVING FORWARD – ASSESSMENT OF MHLS SERVICES

- a) Scope Statement (Supplemental Document)

#### 2) MHLS STAFF SALARY SURVEY

- a) AGREEMENT By and between the MID-HUDSON LIBRARY SYSTEM and CSEA Local 1000 AFSCME, AFL-CIO is to institute a comparative salary study between MHLS and other comparable employers.
- b) Selecting Comparative Organizations
  - i) New York cooperative public library systems, with State funding most similar to MHLS, will be used to collect comparable salary data.





# c) Selecting Comparative Salary Data

- i) A minimum of 3 comparable salaries will be used to calculate MHLS comparable salaries.
- ii) Up to 4 comparable salaries will be used based on data from Four County Library System (Vestal), the North County Library System (Watertown), the Ramapo-Catskill Library System (Middletown), and the Westchester Library System (Tarrytown), the organizations most closely ranked above and below MHLS in State funding.
- iii) If 3 comparable salaries are not available from FCLS, NCLS, RCLS, and WLS, other comparable organizations will be identified based on their ranking above or below MHLS in State funding.

# d) Cost of Living Calculation

- i) All salary data will be reported both in actual amounts and adjusted for cost of living.
- ii) The cost of living calculator used will reference the sources on which the calculations are based. (e.g., <a href="http://www.areavibes.com/cost-of-living-calculator/">http://www.areavibes.com/cost-of-living-calculator/</a>)

#### e) Timeline:

- i) August/September Salary Survey Working Group reviews data from comparable organizations
- ii) September 17 Board meeting Executive Director provide update to the MHLS Board on the salary survey
- iii) October 17 Personnel & Planning Committee considers salary survey findings and develops a recommendation(s) to the MHLS Board
- iv) October 24 MHLS Board meeting executive session to review recommendation(s) of the Personnel & Planning Committee and to determine the Board's plan of action
- v) November Limited negotiations between MHLS and CSEA on salary compensation only
- vi) December 6 Board Meeting Board executive session to review and decide on any proposed CSEA Agreement change(s) regarding salary compensation
- vii) Jan. 1, 2015 Any staff salary adjustments granted by the Board go into effect



### 3) TRAVEL GRANTS

a) When funding permits, the Mid-Hudson Library System (MHLS) provides an equalization mileage grant to its member libraries based, in whole or in part, on the IRS business rate. Reimbursement is contingent on member libraries providing their staff reimbursement at the IRS rate for travel to attend training or to participate in meetings sponsored by and located at MHLS. The number of claims, the amount of the match, and the total available funding shall be periodically determined by the MHLS Board of Trustees. The first 20 miles each way between MHLS and member libraries shall be excluded from reimbursement. Procedures for claims and payment shall be established by the MHLS Executive Director.
