



Policies

All branches of PPLD (Adriance, Boardman, Rover and Sadie Peterson) have been converted to fine free loan rules.

In addition to changing the fining policy, this change also accomplishes:

- Your loan rules have been consolidated. What once required 138 lines od rule policies in the loan rule determiner table has been reduced to 64
- · All branches have a complete set of rules no gaps exist, which will ensure consistent transactions across all item and patron combinations
- Your rules are consistent across all 4 branches
- Your loan rules are organized in itype order for easy management in the future

In the process we also gave Crystal a comprehensive review of loan rules, which I hope will help her in managing circulation policies with you in the future.
