## **Dutchess County: Rajene Hardman**

Ms. Hardman has been unanimously nominated by the Dutchess County Directors Association for a second five-year term (2023-2027)

Rajene Hardeman, MSLIS is a current trustee for the Mid-Hudson Library System and has served as a former trustee for the Howland Public Library. In addition, Rajene is a board member of Wikimedia New York City, and current chair of the Wikipedia and Library Users Group. She also volunteers for the Metropolitan Museum of Art Nolen Library. Her e-bulletin column, "Libraries in Motion" appears bi-monthly for NYLA Voice, the official publication of the New York Library Association. Rajene is a committed community advocate with experience serving environmental organizations, Mozilla Foundation and Tactical Technology Collective, National Alliance on Mental Illness, and numerous library associations, both at the local level and across the globe. She is founding director of DataCrafters LLC, a librarian's consultancy.

## **Ulster County: Heather Blakely**

## **Putnam County: George Joiner**

Mr. Joiner has been unanimously nominated by the Putnam County Library Association to serve a five-year term (2023-2027)

George Joiner was born and raised in the Bronx, graduating from Fordham (AB in Economics) and Wharton (MBA, Industrial Management/Operations Research). Mr. Joiner has worked for IBMN, AT&T-IS, HP and Nextel. In the late 90s he pivoted from large corporations to the "dot com" world where he spent the remainder of his career in leadership positions with three small start-ups. Mr. Joiner served on the Ossining School Board for six years, three of which were as board president, and helped create and implement the "Ossining Plan" which virtually eliminated de factor segregation in the Ossining schools. He twice was elected to the Ossining Village Board and served as Deputy Mayor for two years in addition to service on the Village Zoning Board of Appeals, the Village Planning board and the Town soccer, baseball and basketball boards. Lastly, he was an adjunct professor teaching business and economics at St. Francis College in Brooklyn, The Interboro Institute in Manhattan, and Mercy College in Dobbs Ferry. In retirement, Mr. Joiner has been active in SCORE, a national 501c3 that provides free, confidential business mentoring to small businesses, not for profits, and entrepreneurs.
