MINIMUM PUBLIC LIBRARY STANDARDS

Commissioner's Regulation 90.2 Standards for registration of public, free association and Indian libraries. (c)Variances. If circumstances over which any public, free association or Indian library has no control prevent it from meeting one or more of the standards of service set forward in subdivision (a) of this section, such library may apply for a variance for such standard(s). The application for such variance shall be submitted for such library by the public library system of which such library is a member, in a form prescribed by the commissioner. No variance granted pursuant to this subdivision shall be deemed to relieve a public, free association or Indian library of any obligation imposed by any other provision of federal or state law.

Listed in the table below are descriptions of each standard and the schedule for compliance as outlined in Commissioner's Regulation 90.2.

2.b. Starr Library has up-to-date Bylaws and a Long Range Plan, as well as a current Annual Report to the Community. The library also has about 20 other policies but all of them need to be reviewed (last review was over 5 years ago) and some need to be revised.

3. In July of 2022, the former library director retired and a new director (Jaclyn Savolainen) was hired. Upon reviewing what policies were in place, Jaclyn found that the library has a set of policies but the existing set of policies does not include all of those recommended by the Mid-Hudson Library System and all of them need to be reviewed. There were too many competing demands in the first 8 months as a new director for Jaclyn and the Board of Trustees to update all of the policies in time for filing the annual report to the state.

4. Jaclyn has met with representatives from MHLS to create a plan consisting of two phases for filling in the gaps and updating all the policies. The first phase will be to draft or update and approve by the end of 2023 the DLD recommended policies. The second phase will be to draft or update and approve the remaining policies recommended by MHLS by the end of 2024.
