Executive Director's Report to the MHLS Board | March 2023

1. State Update

- a. Thank you to all who participated in "Advocacy Day" activities. The snowstorm forced all meetings to be rescheduled but we have persevered in getting our messages across with particular emphasis on education as to how the cuts proposed to library and construction aid impact our system and member libraries as well as advocacy for our petition signature reduction bill.
- b. Advocacy work continues as we are still meeting with legislators, working with the New York Library Association to influence the one-house budget bills, and continuing to build support for the petition signature reduction bill. Please watch for and do your best to attend scheduled meetings with legislators in your county as well as office hours held in communities by legislators and their staff – every point of contact helps!

c. I would like to acknowledge the work of Alexa Stroh, MHLS Library Sustainability Associate for her excellent work to not only develop our complex Advocacy Day schedule but for working quickly to help us reschedule in light of the disruptive weather.

2. Annual Report to the State:

- a. In this month's board packet, you will find our annual report to the state. The board is asked to review this report and vote to authenticate it at the March 11th meeting. If you have any questions about the report, please do not hesitate to reach out to me.
- **b.** Member annual reports: Staff are currently reviewing all MHLS member library annual reports. Should any variance request emerge we will report on this and provide the needed background to the board at the May board meeting.

3. Personnel Updates

- a. We have hired James Coyle as our new Financial Assistant.
- b. Farah Faizi, our Administrative Assistant will be on maternity leave until the end of June.
- c. I have worked with our team supervisors to create a new performance evaluation form that will be piloted with staff this year.

4. Facility

- **a.** We have signed a contract with Synergy Design Architecture & Engineering PLLC to provide design, drafting, and oversight of our rooftop replacement and solar installation project this year.
- **b.** In light of the recent mass shootings across the country we have reviewed our facility safety protocols with all staff including entry/exit from the building and the availability of panic buttons. We will be scheduling refresher training for staff on how to best respond in an active shooter situation.
- **c.** Eight staff volunteers will be trained on CPR and use of our new AED unit by the American Heart Association at the end of March.
- **5.** <u>Memo of Understanding Development Update:</u> The second draft is currently being reviewed by member library directors, the MHLS Executive Committee, and our attorney, Ellen Bach.

6. <u>Hudson Valley Digital Inclusion Coalition:</u>

a. On February 16th we co-hosted, along with the Southeastern New York Library Resources Council and the Ramapo Catskill Library System, an event to bring together leaders from across the Hudson Valley who are working to address <u>digital inclusion and digital equity</u> issues. The group agreed it is a worthy cause to continue to build a coalition among those working on these issues in the Hudson Valley to ensure we are prepared to partner together to apply for state funds to address needs in our region. While not all who were invited could attend on this date we were joined by representatives from the following organizations:

- **b.** ConnectALL Regional Listening Sessions: We have been asked by the New York State ConnectALL office to assist with the creation of a regional needs assessment that will influence a statewide digital inclusion plan. This plan will be the basis for how the state expends over \$1 billion to bridge the digital divide. The development timeline for the plan is tight, with the statewide plan being due in August. To this end, we are co-hosting a regional "listening session" that will be held at SUNY Purchase on Friday, March 24th. More information about this event is attached to this report. You are welcome to attend or to provide leads for those who should be invited.

7. Cooperation with other Library Systems

a. At their February meeting, the MHLS Directors Association approved two new Reciprocal Lending Agreements (RLA) for OverDrive access. The agreements made with the Mohawk Valley Library System and the Southern Adirondack Library System will result in an additional 30,000+ unique titles being made available to our library patrons at no cost to the system or our member libraires. We anticipate these agreements will be implemented in April. Our RLA with the Upper Hudson Library System is still in place which tripled the number of unique titles available to our patrons.

8. Trustee Education

- a. The 2023 Trustee Handbook Book Club series kicked off with a presentation from Kristin O'Neill from the Committee on Open Government who helped trustees better understand the recent changes to NYS Open Meetings Law. Our next session is on Tuesday, April 18th at 5:00pm and will address the topic of the Board's relationship with the library director. - **9.** The Library of Local Project: I am currently in talks with our funders for a third year of this project. The third year will look different as no new LoL hubs will be added. The funder is interested in partnering with us to explore how libraries can best play a role in emergency communication networks created

before and after disruptive events in communities. I am exploring partnerships with <u>Radio Kingston</u> and the <u>Ulster County Citizens' Commission for Digital Inclusion</u> to assist with this project. The LoL community of practice will continue to be supported through MHLS with a convening of this group and coordinated programming efforts commencing later this year.

10. Town of Union Vale Update: A third custom training is scheduled for Monday, March 13th.

11. Board Operations

- a. Board Orientation: Directly after the March 11th board meeting, we will offer lunch before our two-hour orientation for new system trustees. This orientation session is designed by the MHLS Board Development Committee to be suitable for our new/newest trustees but, as always, all are welcome to attend.
