Thanks to this event, the Mexican Consulate was able to assist 923 people with passports, renewals, dual critizenship and birth certificates, many of them for children. The highest daily total was on Saturday with 304 people visiting (Daily totals: Tues/187, Wed/143, Thu/119, Fri/170, Sat/304). People traveled from all over the MHLS area and beyond highlighting the valuable cooperation needed to host such an event.
